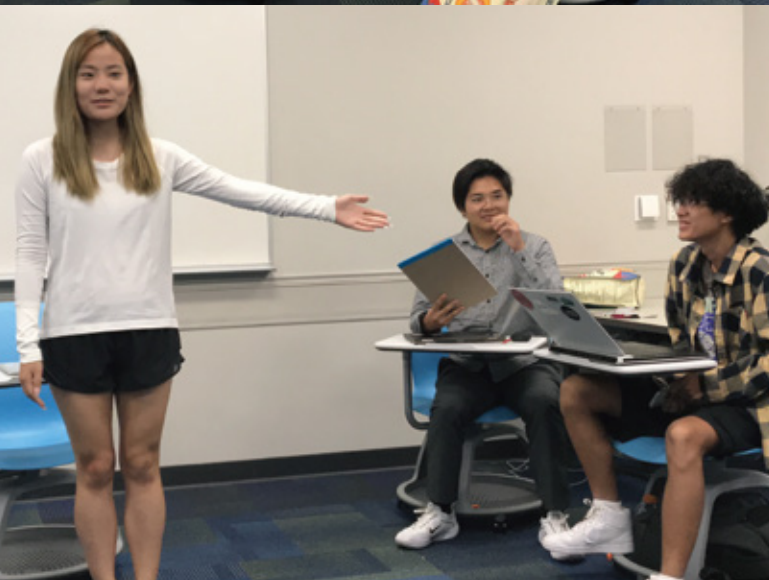




## Classroom Learning

Students enrolled in the daily College Study Skills course which focused on college readiness. Aside from the practical skills taught – from note-taking techniques to academic citations – the UC Davis instructors spent time further developing students' writing skills. The small group classes made it easier for students to receive instructors' feedback on their work. Students completed assignments, essays and as their final project, a presentation on their Dream College.

Classes were held in the beautiful International and Global Affairs Center at the center of campus, close to the Segundo Residences and Dining Commons as well as the Memorial Union, the central hub of student life on campus.





## After class, understanding university studies



### Admissions office talk

On the first day, students arrived at the Welcome Center and listened to a talk by a UC Davis admissions officer. Thereafter, they embarked on a campus tour led by UC Davis student representatives. UC Davis boasts the 3rd largest UC campus – the students visited the highlights.



### Department visits

Students are often not sure about what majors they are interested in, although they are often asked this in their college applications. As they were on campus, the students had a chance to meet with representatives from departments ranging from economics to psychology. Some students had specific requests and we brought them personally to their departments of choice.



### Audit classes

What is it like to attend a college lecture with other college students? The students had opportunities to select from courses of their interest and audit these classes. They were able to practice their note-taking skills and learn more about a subject of their interest. It wasn't always easy to follow the lectures, but it was a valuable, real-life experience!

## After class, exploring university research

UC Davis features dozens of museums and research centers accessible to pre-college students. During this intake, the students were able to visit some of the most popular on-campus destinations.

### Bohart Museum of Entomology

This museum has the 7th largest insect collection in North America and year in, year out, is one of our students most popular visits. Bohart's researchers introduced the world of insects to our students and shared highlights from their research. This visit is sometimes life-changing for some students, in terms of bolstering their bravery in personally handling the large insects!

### Mondavi Food Institute

UC Davis is #1 in agriculture and food science in the U.S. The Mondavi Food Institute is one of the most coveted visits, allow students to witness food technology, wine making and breweries in action. This visit, students investigated the herb farm and worked with lavender during their visit tour.

### UC Davis Student Farms

Davis is surrounded by expansive farms and a wide variety of farm animals. Students enjoyed visiting the UC Davis Dairy Teaching and Research Facility with a herd of over 100 milking cows. They also visited the adorable llamas. UC Davis is #1 in veterinary studies in the U.S.
